Clinical Excellence – Audit is the key Morbidity and Mortality (M&M) Meeting

Shaheed Mohtarma Benazir Bhutto Institute of Trauma has taken the step in good clinical governance. Morbidity and Mortality (M&M) meetings are now started at the Institute. The purpose, scope & responsibilities are as follows:

Purpose:

The SMBB Institute of Trauma is dedicated to providing trauma patients with the highest quality of care. The M&M review process is a critical component of our ongoing commitment to quality improvement, patient safety and professional development. The goal of the Morbidity and Mortality review guidelines for SMBB Institute of Trauma is to create a systematic and structured process for reviewing M&M cases within our institute.

Scope:

The M&M guidelines apply to all SMBB Institute of Trauma healthcare professionals, staff and departments. These guidelines cover the following topics:

- **1. Case Selection:** It defines the criteria for selecting cases for review within the Institute including mortalities and significant morbidities.
- **2. Data Collection:** It describes how to collect relevant medical records, clinical data and other documents pertaining to specific cases.
- **3. Root Cause Analysis:** It directs the systematic investigation of contributing factors and root causes of adverse events, with a focus on human, system and process variables.
- **4. Action Plans:** It provides a framework for creating action plans to address identified issues and avoid negative outcomes in future.
- **5. Education and Feedback:** It encourage the sharing of M&M review lessons learned in order to improve staff education, training and clinical practices.
- **6. Documentation:** The guidelines specify how to keep detailed records of M&M meetings, case presentations, root cause analysis and action plans.







Responsibilities:

The following responsibilities have been assigned to ensure the effective implementation of the Morbidity and Mortality Review Guidelines:

- **1. M&M Committee:** The M&M committee which is comprised of multidisciplinary healthcare professionals is in responsible of overseeing the M&M process, which includes case selection, review, root cause analysis and action plan development.
- **2. Chairperson of the Committee:** The chairperson of the committee is responsible for organizing and leading M&M meetings, ensuring case presentations and tracking the progress of action plans.
- **3. Healthcare Professionals:** All SMBBIT healthcare providers are responsible for attending M&M meetings, providing relevant information and actively participating in discussions to improve patient care and safety.
- **4. Department Heads:** Department heads are in charge of supporting the M&M process within their respective departments, including assigning staff to participate and facilitating action plan implementation.
- **5. Quality Management Department:** The Quality Management Department is in charge of assisting the M&M committee with data collection. record keeping and coordinating educational initiatives based on M&M findings.

The possession of building with execution authority was taken over by SMBB Institute of Trauma. SMBB Institute of Trauma, Karachi will look after all the administrative matters of Shaheed Edhi Ameen, Trauma Emergency Response Center as Execution Agency.





Handing & Taking over to establish Shaheed Benazir Bhutto, Trauma & Emergency Medical Complex at Bin Qasim Town under SMBB Institute of Trauma Karachi

As approved by the Honorable Chief Minister Sindh on 8th May, 2023, Annual Development Plan Scheme, Establishment of Medical Complex at National Highway Near Razzakabad, Bin Qasim Town, Karachi was handed over to establish Shaheed Benazir Bhutto, Trauma & Emergency Medical Complex under SMBB Institute of Trauma Karachi.

Physically and Emotionally Recovery After Physical Trauma

Rehabilitation plays crucial roles in trauma care by helping patients recover physically and emotionally after a traumatic injury.

Physical therapy works on restoring mobility, strength, and function to injured body parts through exercises and stretches, manages neurogenic and musculoskeletal pain, improve overall well-being. Rehabilitation helps prevent complications like muscle atrophy, joint stiffness, or contractures that can arise from prolonged immobility after a traumatic injury and enhance independence in daily activities, providing techniques and tools to adapt to any physical limitations caused by the trauma.

After trauma patients have significant psychological impacts. Rehabilitation involves counseling and emotional support, patients coping with the mental and emotional challenges of recovery.

Rehabilitation of Fractures:

- 1. Rehabilitation of fractures involves a structured process to restore strength, mobility, and function to the injured area.
- 2. Immobilization initially, followed by controlled movement, weight bearing exercises promoted by physical therapist.
- 3. The goal is to promote healing through exercises, prevent stiffness, regain strength, and return the affected area to its normal function

Rehabilitation of Musculoskeletal dislocation:

The rehabilitation process for musculoskeletal dislocations involves several stages aimed at restoring joint function, stability, and strength.

- 1. Initially, the joint might need to be immobilized using a splint, brace, or sling to allow the affected area to heal properly and prevent subluxation.
- 2. After reduction, the joint requires rest to heal. Protection from further injury is crucial, and certain movements or activities might be restricted for a period and elevate it.
- 3. A physical Therapists design specific exercises to gradually improve range of motion, strengthen the muscles around the joint, and restore flexibility and function.
- 4. As the joint's strength and mobility improve, functional exercises are introduced to simulate daily activities and enhance joint stability and coordination.
- 5. The individual gradually returns to normal activities or sports under guidance, ensuring that the joint is strong and stable enough to handle the demands of these activities.

Rehabilitation of Sprains and Strains:

- 1. PRICE Method Immediately after injury, protecting the affected area is essential to prevent further damage. Resting the injured part reduces stress on the tissues and promotes initial healing, applying ice packs and using compression to control swelling, along with elevating the injured area, helps reduce inflammation and pain.
- 2. Gradually improve range of motion, strength, and flexibility. Physical therapy plays a crucial role in this phase to prevent stiffness and regain function.
- 3. Techniques like, mobilization, or manipulation performed by a therapist help improve tissue healing and flexibility.
- 4. Activities and exercises that mimic daily tasks or specific movements related to work, sports, or activities of interest are incorporated to facilitate a safe return to regular activities.

Educating individuals about proper body mechanics, techniques to prevent re-injury, and exercises to maintain strength and flexibility can significantly reduce the risk of future soft tissue injuries.
